THEMES FOR MY PRESIDENCY

I would like to start my first column as President by once again expressing gratitude to Steve Gordon, two Rabbis, a Rabbi Search Committee, a Cantor Search Committee, and our Staff, getting us through a pandemic. Thank you all for your leadership and friendship.

I would like to restate the major themes that motivate me, which I had shared at our yearly congregational meeting.

Kindness - It is so very important while we listen to and discuss different points of view in order to make the best decisions. Clearly, a decision needs to be made in any situation and naturally not all will agree. Hillel, in his explanation of a decision, often started by stating differing points of view first. The take home though is to express what you have to say, then listen to others, and do it respectfully. Do not insult, name call, or belittle. We are a Temple together in a "sacred partnership" and a major part of that is being respectful even when you disagree or don't like something.

Jewish - We are here first and foremost because we are Jewish (or Jewish adjacent) and for all that means to preserve our People and to live a life of Jewish values. Even when you disagree, don't leave! Don't express dissatisfaction through our "pay as you are able" membership structure. NO ONE ELSE is helping support the Jewish People. If you leave or pay less, there is no other entity coming in to take your place. Our People are just weakened. Stay with your People and support us to the best that you are able.

Israel - Make Israel part of your life. I strongly believe in the importance of our Jewish homeland as well as the importance of diaspora Jews. We both need each other for the Jewish people to survive and be such a positive force in the world. Working with the URJ (Union of Reform Judaism) as part of the Israel Cohort I am hoping to integrate Israel more into Temple Israel life. Learn HaTikvah - the beautiful, haunting, and meaningful national anthem. I will be using this column mainly to inform about what leadership is doing. What are all the projects? When I say leadership, I don't just mean the Board, but also the plethora of committees working on so many aspects of Temple life. There is so much going on that it is hard to keep track even for those of us in the know.

Major projects over the next 1-2 years include a rewrite of our bylaws, continuing to utilize and implement - as appropriate - recommendations from the OII report (analysis and recommendations about Temple governance), working on our operational budget and sustainability plan including the crucial Next 100 Years Campaign, shoring up our personnel

work, working on communication on a variety of platforms, strengthening and growing our social action, and so much more. This does not take into account continuing our excellent work on all aspects of education. Of course, our Rabbi finally gets to meet with us in person, along with our new Cantor, so our new team for ritual practice will be beginning to soar.

Please, please talk to us. Let us know what you are thinking, whether it is positive feedback or ideas for modification. Board members always try to identify themselves on Zoom as well as wear their name badges in person. If you don't know someone, walk over and say hi, or send a personal chat message. RITUAL PRACTICE COMMITTEE MESSAGE

After having worked with many amazing and dedicated people on the RPC, I am delighted to head this committee. For people who don't know me, my wife Jane and I joined Temple Israel in 2001 when we moved to Long Beach from Cincinnati with our two children, Caleb and Ruthie. I am a librarian working at the Hebrew Union College in Los Angeles. While the kids flourished in the Torah Center and Madrichim program, Jane

and I were active in HUM and the Torah Center Committee. But when the kids grew up and launched themselves, I wanted to get involved at TI in a more adult-focused way. Luckily, Jennette Fackler, the VP of Ritual Practices at the time, asked me to join the committee.

For those of you who do know me, you might be wondering why someone who does not believe in God, would choose to focus on ritual practice? To which I could respond glibly that I'm only 87% sure that God doesn't exist which leaves a whole 13% where God might live. The less glib answer is that this is something that I struggle with.

I understand evolution (sort of). But how did those first amino acids first find each other? Did they need a little divine help to find each other? And how does evolution account for perfect spring days? Or the uplifting feeling you get surrounded by people singing together? How does a baby grow from a few cells to a being capable of love and communicating? So, for me, these kinds of questions fill 13% of my thinking about God.

I know that there are many reasons people come to Temple Israel. And God may, or may not, be on the list of reasons. But whatever your reasons are, I hope that the Ritual Practices Committee will be able to work with our clergy and staff to provide meaningful services and programs for all our members.

If you have questions or answers or suggestions or musings about the spiritual life at Temple Israel, you are very welcome to join the committee. We generally meet the 3rd Tuesday of the month at Temple Israel.

VERY COOL THINGS AT SAC

Hello Do-Gooders! Long time no speak or see! We may have been stuck indoors, but thanks to your great generosity (both of dollars and energy), Temple Israel is maintaining a face, (and a space) at the forefront of what’s been going on in the community! Here are some *Very Cool Things* that your support has enabled us to do lately. We will be highlighting our favorite non-profits during the next few months, with lots of opportunities for you to get involved. The first couple we’ve worked with are listed below.

Christian Outreach in Action (COA) We continued to support a monthly meal throughout COVID, and there will soon be opportunities again to volunteer. COA provides a nightly meal to 200+ homeless, disabled, and families. All the other nights’ meals are served by local churches; Temple Israel is the *first Jewish organization* to volunteer and they are thrilled to have us! We contributed some of your donations to **Long Beach Community Table (LBCT)**. This little food bank (located at Clark & Artesia) delivers food to seniors, shut-ins, vets, and others that are housebound. In 2019, they were serving about 200-250 families a week, but with COVID the need grew and grew, and now they are serving over 2500 meals a week and are the largest in LB!

We are learning about how to serve people with various dietary needs. We’ve learned about the difference between a food bank and food pantry, food distribution channels, Food Forward (unsellable produce donated by the farmers that would usually be thrown out), local harvesting projects and government feeding programs, where they get milk, cheese, eggs, etc. that are not being used locally. For their B’nai Mitzvah Projects, TI teens Jackson Marschall and Shai Lieber volunteered at LBCT with their families. How cool is that? Please ask them about their experiences!

Please know that your SAC members are busy representing TI on various boards and keeping TI visible in the city, ie: Andrea Friedenthal, LB Homeless Coalition board, NCJW VP of Community Services; Myron Wollin & Harriette Ellis at the Gray Panthers and CLUE; Natalie Swit on various city committees and councils, Paul Levitt runs our citywide participation in Habitat for Humanity arranging a “Jewish build” for Sundays... the list goes on and on!

Ok, there’s much, much more to share, but we’ll save some for next month. Stay tuned, stay involved, and **please keep the donations flowing!**

Your generous donations keep us active in the community and able to help in lots of different situations. You can donate to the Temple Israel Homeless Assistance Fund.

KOL M'YISRAEL / A VOICE FROM ISRAEL

There are always signs of integration when you move to a new place, waypoints marking your progress from tourist to local. Maybe it’s knowing that eatery or café (and becoming accustomed to the abhorrent Tel Aviv prices), learning the language (and the too-real struggle between Hebrew and myself), or gaining citizenship (which as a Jew in the Jewish state, is thrown at you). When it comes to acquiring and embracing the psyche

of the locale, however, there is no forcing the process along or tests to take to mark progress. There are only slight moments of epiphany, when you think to yourself, for better or for worse, “That was so Israeli!” One striking me often lately is the Israelis’ claustrophobia.

Israel is tiny... like, really teeny-tiny. To her detractors, this can come as a shock, especially to those who have infamously labeled Israel’s comparatively gargantuan neighbors as it. Yes, it’s hard to believe... but no, not Egypt... yes, that little, tiny sliver next to it, that’s supposedly world-hypnotizing Israel. It’s often compared to the size of New Jersey. As a West-Coaster, that never much made an impression on me. A more relevant comparison: Israel is the size of Orange, Los Angeles, and Ventura counties combined. The entire country is smaller than the metropolitan region I grew up in, and the southern half is just the Negev Desert. Jerusalem, Haifa, and Gaza are all just an hour’s drive from Tel Aviv, with parts of the West Bank much closer. But these are just the stats.

Partly this claustrophobia is leaching into my mind due to the recent violence when the smallness of Israel allowed her adversaries’ rockets to penetrate deep into the country’s center. One becomes forced to realize that from the river to the sea, not much space can be found. The closeness really pushed in when looking out at the panoramic view gracing the 40th floor where I work. I was struck by the fact that just a couple of miles in one direction was the beach, and in the other, the Gush Dan suburbs spread out, but definitely not sprawled, quickly ending in fields. Beyond them, and not even hazily in the distance, rose the mountains demarking foreign lands.

Of course, these feelings have only been rushed by the coronavirus and the resulting closure of international borders. With only a total of a few weeks of the last two years spent abroad, many vacations and getaways have now been arrived at by traveling along the one road heading north and the one south. After noticing that each forest or desert destination, respectively, is reached by the same journey, I started to notice that the destinations themselves were also basically the same spots too. While the beauty of Israel is bountiful, the eyes become sore for a change. I find myself developing one of the most Israeli of all yearnings: the desire to jet off to nearby Europe.

A Letter to the SCIC Community from Milia Islam Majeed

I pray that you had a joyous July 4th! This day of celebration holds such a special meaning to so many, including my family. My parents migrated to America over 30 years ago during the month of July to achieve the American dream. Indeed, it was this great nation that afforded them the opportunity to do so.

Like so many first-generation immigrants, they left their native land of Bangladesh to build a better and more prosperous future for their children - my brother and me. They wanted to ensure that we obtained the best possible education and with it, serve the greater community. Starting their lives completely over, I witnessed the

hardships that many immigrants face as my father - a decorated army colonel - worked to build his eyeglass business during the day only to go to McDonalds at night to work the graveyard shift while my mother - an aspiring zoologist in Bangladesh - worked in the shoe factory sewing soles onto children's shoes so as to support our family.

The years of hard work and sacrifice that my parents made - and the infinite blessings of God first and foremost - resulted in the privilege of my older brother becoming a physician and me being able to serve you as the Executive Director of the South Coast Interfaith Council that I love so deeply. This dream of my parents could not have actualized without the countless number of people who went from becoming strangers to friends and, ultimately, like family.

Along this journey, we became citizens of this country and understood firsthand the gift of having the right to vote and, by doing so, contributing to the story of America. To this day, we remain indebted to so many who came before us and fought for the freedoms that we continue to enjoy today. As I was looking through an old scrapbook last night, I found a few newspaper cutouts that documented this momentous milestone - please see the picture above.

One thing I am continuously reminded of is something that my father told us after we took the oath to become American citizens. He stated, "Always remember that with this great privilege comes a great responsibility to be of service to this country and ensure that others are given this same right. We are stronger when all people - no matter who they are or what they look like - are granted an opportunity to succeed."


As I was watching the fireworks last night all these memories rushed back to me. Certainly no nation is perfect, but there's no place else that I would rather live...for this is home.


